We are an all volunteer organization, a 501c3 California Public Benefit Corporation, EIN #26-0597892. We focus on very low cost fund raising efforts, avoiding unnecessary expenses so that almost 100% of donations go to those in need.

PRESIDENT'S LETTER



Dear Friends,

Once again, I am pleased to have the opportunity to thank all of you. I am so

grateful for your generosity, supporting our work and making it possible!

2013 was an exciting year for The Greater Contribution. Through your generosity, we closed out the year having provided 621 new loans for a total of 8551 micro loans since beginning this work in 2006 while keeping our expenses at a low 7.9%. We also did a lot of preparation for two new loan hubs that opened in January 2014! You can read more of the specifics of this work in the following pages and it's important to remember what this work means. Here are some of the ways these loans impact the people of Uganda.

School, medicine, and improved nutrition are results of these loans. From our field members on the ground we constantly get reports of the very tangible impact these loans have on the lives of these people. The women borrowers report that they are able to send more of their children to school, that their families are healthier since they can provide needed medical care and that they are eating more meals per day! Women report that they have gone from eating one meal a day to two meals a day or more. They report that they no longer have someone in their family who is regularly sick because now they can get medical treatment for them. They proudly report that more and more of their children are going to school!

Education and a role in their community. One typical borrower reports "I'm now counted among the business community. "Another says: "I can reason like a business lady and my opinion as a business lady is taken seriously." "I'm grateful for teaching us proper business."

Hope is restored and a future provided.

Annette, the Loan Administrator in our new hub in Lwaboba wrote, "thank you for the lives of many women that you have changed within a minute and for their beautiful smiles that show real hope restored." Previously she had told me that she and the other women in the village were losing hope of ever being able to improve their lives and the lives of their children.

It is remarkable what a difference we can make in the lives of others through this remarkable little tool called a micro loan.

Through sharing the abundance in our lives, we can do something really extraordinary. We are truly transforming lives.

All of us here at The Greater Contribution are aware that we could not do this work without all of you! Thank you for making another year of micro loans and growth out of poverty possible.

RESPONDING TO UNMET NEEDS

The Greater Contribution Responds to Unmet Needs of Rural Women

2013 was a year of responding to the unmet needs of women in new communities of rural Uganda. As TGC became known in the region for involvement in a successful micro loan program, word spread to untouched rural communities. Throughout the year, TGC received requests by letter and email to assist various communities of women across Uganda seeking the opportunities that micro loans could bring them. We could not turn away from their pleas and their obvious need for a program that could support real and sustainable economic opportunity and growth in their villages.

They reached out to TGC so that more Pittek women could have the opportunity to start or expand their own small businesses. TGC proudly funded 27 new loans to these women in 2013. Read more about some of

the Pit-tek borrowers later in this report.

without many resources. Their established infrastructure allowed us to fairly quickly partner with these groups to provide micro loans. One of the established groups was the Pit-tek Women's group of Jinja. The group was established by women refugees, who had fled their family homes in northern Uganda during the bloody civil war. Many of the women had become the sole support of their families after losing their husbands and other family members. They found themselves completely starting over without land, housing, or jobs. They formed a group to help support one another in a new community. When we visited them in February of 2013, the organization had already established a great vocational

Near the end of 2013, TGC also funded micro loans to two other women's groups that had previously been established and had significant infrastructure in place. One such group was Volunteer Action Network (VACNET). Vac-Net is a non-profit established to undertake social and economic interventions

that reduce vulnerability to poverty, disease, hunger and illiteracy. Their women's group is located in Gulu in northern Uganda. TGC funded 24 micro loans to women in that group in December of 2013.

TGC also funded 27 micro loans for the Natiki women's group located in Kakoro, Uganda. Kakoro is a rural village located 27 kilometers (approximately 17 miles) outside of the nearest city, Mbale, which is a great distance in rural Uganda. Isolated by extremely poor dirt roads and lack of transportation, the group sought to establish financial services locally. They began with a savings group to help support local women. Their small savings were used to

help one woman at a time pay for a child's school fees or medicine for a family member. Looking for a more sustainable source of income, the group found a benefactor for a few micro loans, but the benefactor disappeared. They learned of TGC's micro loan program and sought us out to help them expand their micro loan program in their village, so that more women might have the opportunity to create a sustainable income. Funding from TGC has allowed 27 women to continue on their road out of extreme poverty.

In the summer of 2013, Karon Wright received an email (below) from which we could not turn away.

Dear Karon Wright,

I am Suzan, a women group leader in Tororo district in Eastern Uganda. I saw your website and the things you do as I searched for help for this women group on the net. I have hopefully decided to appeal for your Organization help because this women group falls within the brackets of your Organization.

Winning Women Tororo is a group of twenty five (25) extremely poor women who have come together to see how we can develop ourselves, families and the community out off poverty. The group consists of single mothers, youths, married women and widows. Each of these women has at least a small business which include: fruit and vegetables selling, charcoal selling, handicrafts making, poultry, goats rearing,

piggery and saloon. However, all is done on minimal scale due to small capital.

Our main objective is to come out of poverty, become self sustainable develop to be responsible parents and an example in the community.

We have seen how you have helped many women already to achieve such goals and our prayer and request is that please include us in your agenda too. We will change the lives of many around our community.

We pray for good health for you.

In September 2013, our president, Karon Wright responded to Suzan's letter by paying a visit to the Winning Women and The Women's Hunger Eradication Group of Lwaboba, Uganda. Karon was impressed with, not only their need for our loan program, but their willingness to work with us to develop the supportive structure necessary to establish a successful loan program in these two communities. Leaders emerged and local women agreed to be trained to become loan administrators and business trainers in their respective communities. The decision was made to move forward with establishing our micro loan program in these two communities.

During the last few months of 2013, the necessary groundwork for launching two new loan groups at the beginning of 2014 was established. Training for the business trainers and loan administrators took place in January 2014. After the leaders and trainers complete their training, over 100 new women borrowers will receive their own business training and their first TGC micro loans. 2014 looks to be an important milestone for TGC. As we reach out to

these new communities with our loan program, The Greater Contribution will be meeting an unmet need for capital in their rural villages and providing the support and training necessary to ensure business success and a sustainable income for these impoverished women.

Micro Loans allow borrowers to overcome great challenges

fter fleeing her home during Uganda's civil war, Cecilia lost her husband in an accident leaving her to care for their four children alone. Fortunately, Cecilia has a wonderful skill; she embroiders beautifully. She needed a loan in order to expand her business and create a more sustainable income. TGC provided her a micro loan in April 2013. In just four months, she has been able to increase her income from less than .50/day to more than \$5/day. This significant increase in income has made it possible for her to feed her children three meals per day. She says "I'm able to pay rent for the house I'm staying in promptly. The landlord no longer locks me out." She

says she can now hold her head high as a successful businesswoman.

Rose's story begins in tragedy but continues with hope and triumph. During Uganda's bloody civil war, Rose was beaten into unconsciousness and her husband blinded. She and her family were forced to flee their family home and relocate. Due to her husband's blindness, she became the family's sole wage earner. Life was extremely difficult with six children in her care. She was fortunate to join our partner, the Pit-tek women's group. She joined their beading group allowing her to save a little money to start her own business. With the TGC loan she received in 2013, she was

able to expand her business and increase her income. As a result of her increased income, her family has enjoyed more nutritious meals and she has been able to pay the school fees for one more of her six children to attend school. She also increased her savings, with which she hopes eventually to be able to buy a home for her family.

Since her husband has been unable to find work, Alice has become the sole provider for her family of four. She has struggled to make enough money to provide proper medical care and pay school fees. After receiving TGC's micro loan, she has fortunately been able to increase her income to over \$3/day. She is now a proud businesswoman, proud of her ability to keep good records and works to gain more customers. She can now

pay school fees more easily and the family's health has improved. She looks forward to saving enough to buy a house as well.

In a manage with 2 lovely daughters. I thank God I'm alive and have joined a sisterhood group with a caring organization. I received my first loan of \$60 in December 2013 after attending 2 weeks training on how to manage business but more importantly how to save both in cash and in kind I learned how to keep records on a daily basis which improved my business. I have repaid back fully my first loan and received the second loan of \$100. To date I can buy

scholastic materials for my 2 daughters who have just started school because I can be able to send them to school using my quarterly savings from my business. At home we can feed on better meals, at least I can buy meat once in a while this has never happened before. My dream is to work hard buy my land however small it will be and construct my house so that we can have a permanent home. I love the program for teaching me and supporting me to start my business. I thank The Greater Contribution for supporting our group. I believe soon after a few loans my business will be stable. God bless you!

Prior to receiving a TGC micro loan, Catherine says that there was not enough income to run her business and send her five children to school. Amazingly, Catherine has been able to increase her income ten-fold after receiving her TGC micro loan and receiving business training from our partner, Pit-tek. She has been able to expand her business, broadening her offerings from just silver fish to include onions as well. She now proudly tells her friends that her business is going well and that she can pay school fees, allowing three more of her children

to attend school. She has increased her savings and hopes, like many of our displaced borrowers, to be able to save enough to buy a house again some day.

upina is married with seven children. She had started a small business of selling silver fish, a staple in the region around Lake Victoria. Initially, she had insufficient capital to make it profitable. Since receiving a micro loan from TGC in April 2013, she has been able to increase her income to more than \$2/day. Prior to receiving the loan, she said that one of her goals was to be able to help pay school fees for one more of her children to attend school. She can now proudly say that due to her increased income she has achieved that goal. Now all of her children are able to attend school. She says that she is now proud of herself as a successful businesswoman. She hopes to save enough money to be able to buy a house for her family some day.


